Curriculum vitae

Prof. Dr. Andreas Frewer, M.A. is Professor at the Institute for History of Medicine and Medical Ethics at the University of Erlangen-Nuremberg (Germany). He studied medicine, philosophy, and the history of medicine in Munich, Erlangen, Berlin, Vienna, Oxford, and Jerusalem. He wrote his dissertation on medical ethics and history of medicine at the Free University of Berlin (summa cum laude) and holds a European Master in Bioethics from the Universities of Leuven, Nijmegen, Basel, and Padua (summa cum laude). Between 1994 and 1998 he worked as a physician at the Virchow-Hospital and the Charité of Humboldt University (Berlin) in clinical medicine, nephrology, oncology and the intensive care unit. Between 1998 and 2002 he was Assistant Professor at the Institute of Ethics and History of Medicine at the University of Goettingen and a member of the Institutional Review Board (Research Ethics Commission). Between 2002 and 2006 he was Professor for Medical Ethics at the Institute for History, Ethics, and Philosophy of Medicine at Hanover Medical School (MHH), and 2004 Managing Director of the Institute for History and Ethics of Medicine at the Goethe-University in Frankfurt/Main. Since 2007 Prof. Frewer is member of the Institutional Review Board (IRB/REC) and Manager of the Clinical Ethics Committee (CEC) at the University Hospital Erlangen.

Among his publications are more than 200 articles and several books on Medical Ethics and History of Medicine (e.g. "Medizin und Moral in Weimarer Republik und Nationalsozialismus"), publications on ethics committees, research ethics, end-of-life-issues, and on the wide spectrum of clinical ethics. Prof. Frewer is a member of the German "Academy for Ethics in Medicine" (AEM), of international Editorial Boards of the journals "Theoretical Medicine and Bioethics", and "Medicine, Health Care and Philosophy". He is editor of the series "Culture of Medicine" (40 vols.), "History and Philosophy of Medicine" (12 vols.), "Clinical Ethics" (5 vols.), and the "Yearbook Ethics in Clinics" (YEC, 7 vols. since 2008).
